 - Advocacy
 - Do you have successes/challenges to share with WMEA?
 - Olympia is being discussed at the WMEA level we don't want this to be a trend. Keith - letter from Ron missed the mark a little bit, becoming hostile, saying one thing and doing another, not taken out of context (context actually makes it worse). Grant - during times of cuts it doesn't mean they will be cut forever and to continue advocacy to bring it back. Randy - superintendents are talking to each other. John - Diversity and Inclusion committee for ACDA, is there one for WMEA?
 - Can help with communicating with superintendents and school boards
 - All-State Honor Group Task Force Proposals
 - #3 live auditions eliminates tech issues and inequities with microphones and recording devices, less time for teachers for recording auditions. Will rehearsal locations bounce around within the region? Could they do smaller region rehearsals then do larger region rehearsals for the last rehearsal? No hotels, music out months in advance, time to prep the music. Do we know yet how this will impact the costs for participation fees? What does the participation fee go towards?
